

PRAYERS.

The Honourable Senator Copp from the Standing Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbours, presented the following Report:—

WEDNESDAY, 2nd August, 1944

The Standing Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbours to whom was referred the Bill (133 from the House of Commons), intituled: "An Act to amend the Aeronautics Act," have in obedience to the order of reference of 26th July, 1944, examined the said Bill, and now beg leave to report the same with the following amendment, viz:—

Page 4, lines 7 to 16. For paragraph (k) substitute the following:—

- (k) prescribing penalties, enforceable on summary conviction, for—
- (i) contravention of or failure to comply with any such regulation, or
 - (ii) furnishing false information in any return required to be furnished or filed pursuant to any such regulation, or
 - (iii) making a false statement in any return required to be furnished pursuant to any such regulation, such penalties not to exceed a fine of one thousand dollars or imprisonment for six months, or both such fine and such imprisonment, and, as an additional or alternative penalty, the cancellation or suspension of any licence issued under this Part;

All which is respectfully submitted.

Strike out the word "Minister" where it appears in the tenth line of Page 5, Section 12, Subsection 8, and substitute therefor the following:—

Governor in Council, which appeal must be held and decided upon within three months from the date of the filing of said appeal.
