My dear Sir:

I thank you for your kind letter of February 1st, about calling a little group for preliminary meeting with which I might meet to outline the plans for the Montreal effort of the Grenfell Endowment in May.

I note with regret that your own duties at the University and those of Dr. Adams, make it impracticable for you to endeavor to call together some people for this preliminary conference.
