modation in the steerage is better than might be expected for the money, and will suit the labouring classes very well; but I should advise those who can afford it to take an intermediate passage. Altogether the voyage is made as comfortable as possible, and when I went out there was a general feeling of satisfaction

experienced in clearing it (unless goods intended for sale be included), especially if the owner has a through ticket for Winnipeg or some other town in Manitoba.
