The two last are placed just in the center of our French settlements, which effectually keeps the inhabitants in awe. At the head of the bay of Fundy, between that and the bay of Vert, upon a narow isthmus, of but a few miles across, is the garrison of Checonecto, where they have about eight hundred men in garrison. As this isthmus is very narrow, which the Indians must pass to come at any of our fettlements, (which are all upon the peninfula) this fort deters them greatly from coming down upon our fettlements, for
