Wanted in Italy for Assassinating Rival for the Leadership of Sinister Society.

NEW YORK, April 21.—A police raid on an obscure resort in the underground world of the east side, has brought to light the romantic story of an Italian bandit a fantastic Neapolitan Rob Roy of great secret power, who, fleeing from his native country, to escape arrest for assassination, came to America to wield the same power which was his abroad.

The man is Enrico Alfano, called "Efricane," head of the mysterious "Camorra" of Naples, or Camorra, an Italian organization of terrorists. When the police raided the east side den one night last week Alfano was discovered crouching in a corner seeking to escape the glare of the policeman's lantern.

He obtained a false passport and escaped to the United States disguised as a student. By the name of Camorra, the chief was greeted with many honors. A feast was prepared in recognition of the leader's arrival, and Alfano was seated at the "table d'honneur." But this feast was his undoing.
