TRADE IN CANADA. Niagara Falls, Ont., Oct. 15,—(Special.)—he plant of the Canadian Elastic Web ompany, a branch factory of a large Amdican firm, which for some time past has been offered for sale, will be moved in the burse of a few weeks to Chelsie, Mass. In staple one factory has been built and in operation are for eight years and employed on an elowering of the tariff two years ago nocked the bottom out of their Canadian usiness, and consequently the plant will e sent back to the States. The tendency of the hide market has continued upwards, and dealers are paying a cent more for green hides, sheepskins are also higher. Leather men established an advance of a cent in sole this week, and for splits firmer figures are demanded. The trade situation at Toronto is apparently without change. The steady advancing prices of grain tend to create a better feeling, which, however, is offset by competition in trade and the financial embarrassment of a large woolen house. This failure, following so closely upon that of a large millinery house, has naturally a bad effect and the trade are suspicious. Both these disasters are attributed to the underselling of goods and the difficulty of making collections. Their misfortunes are also attributed to the large departmental store trade carried on in this city. Doing business on the "cash" principle has many advantages. One of these is low prices, and wholesaile dealers of limited financial backing cannot necessarily compete, and keep afloat. There is a moderate trade in spring dry goods, and hardware and grocery dealers report a fair trade. Sugars are weaker. The high prices of hides ought to stimulate the demand for leather, but boot and shoe manufacturers are averse to laying in stocks. The opinion seems to be that
