The Queen Consort, the wives and daughters of knights and some other women of exalted position, were designated "Dames de la Fraternite de St. George," and entries of the delivery of robes and garters to them are found at intervals in the wardrobe accounts from 1376 to 1405. The effigies of Margaret Byron, wife of Sir Robert Harcourt, K.G., at Stanton Harcourt, and of Alice Chancer, wife of the Duke of Suffolk, K.G. at Eweime, which date from the reign of Henry VI, and Edward IV., have garters on their left arms. Mr. McPherson, however, insisted upon citing some authorities for the benefit of Mr. Justice Street, much against Mr. A. B. Aylesworth's wish.

The matter ended in the court fixing upon next Saturday as the time for hearing the preliminary objections to the petition brought by the Liberals, which may dispose of that petition. The question as to the legality of a marked cheque as a deposit yet remains undecided.
