New York, May 11.—Sentence was to day pronounced upon William L. Sanford, formerly assemblyman from the First District of King's County, and former under sheriff, and William J. 

This form of ticket has been decided upon in deference to the request of numer-ous patrons of the lime desiring om ticket good over several lines instead of having to provide themselves, as at present, with a separate ticket for each line they desire to use.
