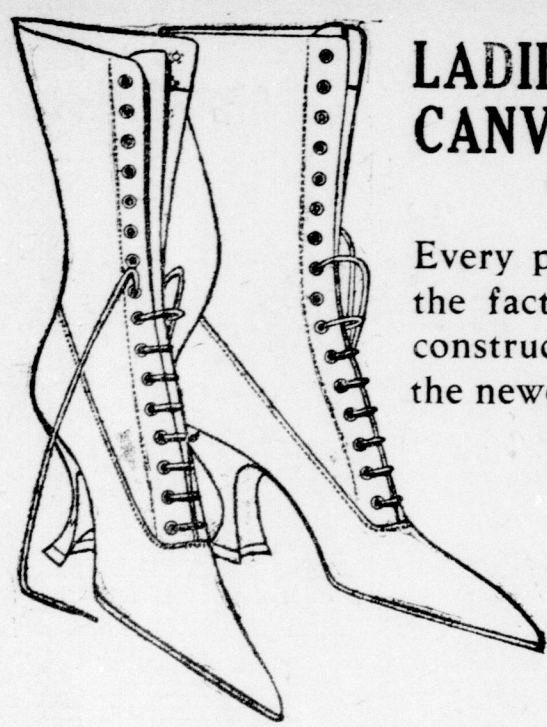

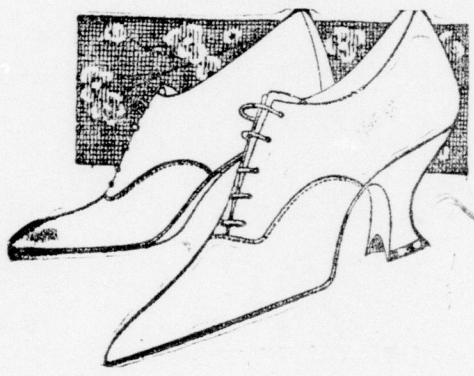

GRAND JURY FINDS PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS IN GOOD CONDITION

Inmates All Contented and Fairly Happy.

CHANGE ASYLUM NAME

Recommendation Is That It Be Called the Ontario Hospital.

The report of the grand jury in the general sessions of the peace was received by Judge Talbot Macbeth at the County Buildings today. The jury inspected the county jail buildings, the Hospital for the Insane, and the Byron Sanatorium, reporting all three institutions to be in first-class condition. The inmates in these institutions were satisfied with conditions, and the jury complimented the staff administering to returned soldier patients numbering 221 at the Byron Sanatorium. The preventorium for children at this place was also an object of compliment, there being 30 young patients receiving treatment there.

Would Change Name. The members recommended that the name, Hospital for the Insane, be changed to "Ontario Hospital, London," and that electric fans be placed in the washing and ironing rooms at this institution, and on the veranda for sick patients. They found 1,183 patients in the Hospital for the Insane, 630 females and 553 males.

Favors Electrocution. The grand jury also recommended that capital punishment be carried out in a central penitentiary, electrocution being favored as a means of inflicting the death penalty, instead of hanging as at present, which was condemned by them. In reviewing the report, Judge Macbeth complimented the jurors, under Foreman E. E. Harley, for their good work, and promised to forward the recommendations to the proper authorities for consideration. He stated that he was glad that capital punishment had not been carried out in this county for years, and hoped that it would never be necessary to again inflict the penalty in this district. Having completed their duties for the June session of the county court, the grand jury was then discharged by Judge Macbeth.
