KENNEDY ESTATE STILL UNSETTLED

Private Bills Committee of the Legislature Refuses to Grant Exemption.

All things considered, Toronto had a comparatively easy time of it before the private bills committee of the legislature yesterday. The committee killed several proposals, but made up for it later on by extending a more friendly spirit.

There was only a slim attendance of members when consideration of the city's request was granted, the project of erecting a new building, instead of continuing to enjoy a fixed assessment of \$500 an acre as a perk.

Authority was given to issue debentures to raise \$100,000 for a sewer on the C. N. E. grounds for the exhibition of food products, at a cost of \$250,000.

Two clauses valuating tax sales were given assent to. Objection was raised to the clause giving the city power to establish the whole or part of any street during certain hours of the day for playground purposes.

Clause 8, giving council power to designate certain streets or districts as strictly residential, was approved.

A joint initiation and entertainment under the auspices of the American Order of United Workmen was held at night in the Orange Hall, it being the forty-first meeting of Grand Lodge No. 10,000, B. O. O. F.

Grand Lodge opens its session today in Toronto, when amendments to the constitution will be dealt with.
