Then she pushed on the stage, be-fore the lady who had performed the previous part of the character could come on, and exhi-bited a more perfect representation of madness than the utmast exertions of release than the utmost exertions of mimic art could effect. She was, in truth, Ophelia berself, to the amazement of the performers, and to the aston-ishment of the audience. Nature having made this last effort, her vital powers failed her. On going off, she exclaimed—"It is all over!" She was immediately conveyed back to her place of security, and in a few days after,
