

From the Annual Report of the YORK PIONEER AND HISTORICAL SOCIETY, for the year ending 28th February, 1891 :

Average attendance at monthly meetings thirty-five, being two over the previous year.

Number of members deceased, fifteen ; new members elected, forty-four. The Annual Excursion, made this year to Brampton, took place on the 18th of June, and was thoroughly enjoyed by all who took part in it, and a grand reception we met with at that enterprising town.

At the Exhibition in September, the visitors to the Pioneers' Cabin were numerous, and the interest shown in the proceedings of the Society appears to be every year increasing.

In December, 1890, the Society was incorporated and the name changed from that of YORK PIONEER SOCIETY to YORK PIONEER AND HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

A quantity of handsome emblematic certificates of membership have been lithographed, and all members in good standing are entitled to have one at cost. To the families of deceased members who were in good standing a copy will be sent free.
