

SAW BOTTLE AT OFFICIALS' LIPS

Upshaw Lashes Wash-
ton Leaders as Customers
of Bootleggers.

Representative Upshaw, Democrat of Georgia, in a speech in the House of Representatives this week, declared that "bootleggers ply their trade among too many public men in Washington," and that he had seen with his eyes "some of the highest officials in Washington, not members of either branch of Congress, lifting the devilish bottle to their lips."

Commenting on reports that liquor imported for embassies and legations under diplomatic immunity was being diverted into bootleg channels, Mr. Upshaw said this power could be used for "delicate, but firm treatment."

To Give Evidence.

The Georgia representative told the House he would not make public the names of senators and representatives who "do not practice the prohibition which their votes profess," but would promptly turn over to federal and local authorities all evidence relating to liquor drinking by Government officials placed in his hands.

he will "turn in the name of a high official (not a diplomat) who returned from abroad some time ago with more than a score of cases of foreign liquor marked 'diplomatic'."

Answering his own question as to why he did not give the House the names of his "drinking" members, Mr. Upshaw said the House was not a justice court and that Congress was not a police matinee.

Referring to his recent speech in which he brought up the subject of bootleg liquor drinking by high officials, the Georgia representative said he had made no threat that he would publish the names of known offenders. "I did not brandish a sword; I made an appeal," he declared. "Some newspapers naturally put into the same news story with my general charges the simultaneous arrest here of a certain guided bootlegger. They naturally inquired I would go after his list of customers. I did not have to. I know enough already to well nigh break the heart of any man who loves to see public men walk in sobriety and righteousness before the youth of the land."

"Pity Devilish Trade."

"Firm Treatment"

Touching on liquor shipped from abroad to embassies and legations at Washington, Mr. Upshaw declared:

"On problem that calls for delicate treatment, is the use and abuse of liquor shipments to some of our foreign embassies. An able man who was an attaché of our state department, then for more than thirty years has written me in desperate seriousness on the question. He has seen the prohibition ideals of this prohibition country slowly but surely being destroyed from all foreign legations who would really rejoice, once they saw our position, to help the United States, the first great nation, to have launched at all time, to work out here at the heart of national and international influences, that great plan for redemption of the world, mainly contemplated in the ratification of the 18th amendment."

MOTHERS OF ONTARIO ARE GIVEN \$1,382,195

Allowances in Toronto Alone Amount to \$300,000.

(Toronto Globe.)

In Toronto 689 mothers receive assistance from the Mothers' Allowances Board. During 1922 local pensions totalled \$304,185. Of this 98 per cent was paid by the city. Over the whole province the sum of \$1,382,195 was paid out to mothers.

In the annual report of the Mothers' Allowances Local Board just received, much information is given of the work that is being done to help destitute families. Since October, 1920, the local board has dealt with 1,243 applications, of which 948 have been declared eligible for assistance. In 1922, 221 families of the best men in Congress said to me: 'We are with you. I wish you could stop liquor drinking in this house office building.'

Great care has been taken in investigating all cases. Allowances of thirty-three Toronto applicants have been cancelled during the year. These have been referred to the Children's Aid Society. The local board declared twenty-four applicants eligible who were later declared ineligible by the Provincial Commission. According to the report, these mothers are now supported by the city and various charities.

As an insight into habits of thrift the report points out that, in 1922, the father had begun the purchase of a home for his family. This is 10 per cent of the total.

Woman, 73, Held on Drug Charge.

New York, Jan. 17.—Magistrate H. Stanley Renaud, in the Tombs Court held Mrs. Lena San Marco, 73, in \$5,000 bail for examination. She was accused of having drugs in her possession when her home was raided. Nine others arrested with her were held in \$300 bail each for trial in special sessions.
