SIR A. CURRIE UNVEILS TABLET

Sham, Hypocrisy, Intolerance Banished from the Trenches, Said the Commander.

A strong attack on "sham, hypocrisy and intolerance," which the fighting men had banished from the trenches, was made Sunday night by Gen. Sir Arthur Currie, commander of Canada's war-time forces and principal of McGill University, in the course of an address which he delivered after he had unveiled a memorial tablet in Kensington Presbyterian Church, Montreal, to those who fell and those who served in the Great War.

"I have unveiled a great many tablets," said Sir Arthur, in commencing his speech, "and my first thought and sympathy is always for those who are connected with the names of the fallen. Although it is true that they were cut down in the full vigor of their manhood, yet their lives were fully lived. There was no throwing away, for these men gave their lives willingly. In the life of a race a single generation is but a heartbeat, but these lives will forever endure."

The war was five years of emotion, effort, failures and successes, victories and defeats, laughter and tears. In future years the world will look back and try to estimate the effect of all this. The war was the greatest event of Canada's life, for we had had nothing since Confederation to really make the country realize its unity. There was never once the flutter of a white flag from one end of Canada to another.

The "Christ of the trenches," testified Sir Arthur, "was the Christ of the Cross. Overseas we had the religion which says: 'Quit ye like men and be strong—religion, stripped of all its petty affections and the gasmer of life. There were no pealing organs, no surplined choir, but it was the standby of thousands of the best fellows all over the U. S. and Canada."

It goes to establish the antiquity of man in America. Theories have been propounded in regard to an early civilization on this continent, and the remains that have never been found any authentic evidence.

Pyramid Marks First Days of Man in Mexico

Ancient Pile Measures 400 Feet in Diameter, is 100 Feet High and Constructed of Unhewn Stone.

Mexico City, Jan. 17.—A pyramid of unknown age, but probably antedating any hitherto found on the American continent, is being unearthed at Teotihuacan Hill, in the center of a lava field about nine miles from Mexico City. The expedition is headed by Dr. Byron Cummings, director of the Carnegie Museum, and dean of the University of Arizona, and Dr. Manuel Gamio, director of anthropology and archaeology of Mexico, while the continued excavation is furnishing the men and otherwise financing the expedition.

Nature Preserves Relics. Nature has employed the same means of preservation here as in Pompeii, for the structure is covered and sealed with a coating of lava from the ancient Ajusco volcano. This eruption is calculated as having taken place two or three thousand years ago, but long before that time the pyramid had been covered with a layer of volcanic mud and ashes, which, when there are numerous vestiges to show that an abundant vegetation had sprung up. Although it is impossible to determine the age of the pyramid with any degree of exactness, it was probably built a great many centuries before the pyramid of Quetzalcoatl at Teotihuacan, which Dr. Gamio estimates was erected about the first century, A. D.

Culucillo, which is an Indian word for mound, is the far the only monument near the city of the ancestors of those tribes which were later to fall into Mexico, with magnificent works of architecture. The character of the implements found in the vicinity also serves to corroborate the theory that the pyramid is the possessor of an immensely great age.

First of Race Traced. The entire structure contains no hewn stone, cement or plaster in any form, while the implements, knives, borers and scrapers are rough and unpolished. The pottery that has been found is rude and archaic, and everything goes to demonstrate that the work is that of a people in any degree of primitive human culture.

Though the Mexican ruins probably lack the beauty of the recent discoveries in Egypt, it is unlikely that they are inferior to them in point of age. Evidently the beginnings of civilization on this side of the Atlantic began to gleam forth about the same time as among the peoples of the Mediterranean basin.

Esterbrook, of Brooklyn, Under Fire; Kihill Appeals to President of the Bench.


New York, Jan. 17.—O. Grant Esterbrook, Brooklyn Municipal Court judge is under fire, because of an alleged refusal to permit the postponement on Yom Kippur of a case in which the lawyer for the defense was of the Jewish faith. A complaint against Judge Esterbrook has been sent to the Board of Municipal Courts, by the Kihill, a Jewish community organization.

The complaint, which is signed by William Lieberman as counsel for the Kihill, asks for a definite ruling by the board to make it imperative that lawyers who are interested in cases called for trial on days which they are observing as religious holy days shall be entitled to have the case marked "ready and passed for the day."



MOTHERS OF ONTARIO ARE GIVEN \$1,382,195

Allowances in Toronto Alone Amount to \$300,000 (Toronto Globe).

In Toronto 689 mothers receive assistance from the Mothers' Allowances Board. During 1922 local positions totaled \$294,185. Of this \$9 per cent was paid by the city. Over the whole province the sum of \$1,382,195 was paid out to mothers.

In the annual report of the Mothers' Allowances Local Board just received, much information is given of the work that is being done to help destitute families. Since October, 1920, the local board has dealt with 1,243 applications, of which 948 have been declared eligible for assistance. In 1922, 221 families were added to the list. The board has dealt with 196 families of men totally incapacitated and men who had deserted.

Great care has been taken in investigating all cases. Allowances of thirty-three Toronto applicants have been cancelled during the year. These have been referred to the Children's Aid Society. The local board declared twenty-four applicants eligible who were later declared ineligible by the Provincial Commission. According to the report, these mothers are now supported by the city and various charities.

As an annual report of habits of thrift the report points out that, in 1866 the father had begun the purchase of a home for his family. This is 10 per cent of the total.
