

that is necessary for the work to be done. Mr. McLennan, who showed me through the place, didn't escape without being reminded of one or two things that private rooms, an X-ray apparatus, operating room, maternity ward, broad balcony for patients, and the best of equipment for cooking and serving food. 

The most modern equipment has been purchased to meet the extra demand and when completed, the mill will be up-to-date in every respect.

The wood room is being enlarged and in the power plant, modern equipment is being installed. This part of the programme is nearly complete. Twelve old boilers have been taken out and eight new ones set up while new, automatic stokers are being installed and space is being provided for large coal storage purposes.
