### MARINE NOTES

The steamer Wistley of the Pracad Line, sailed early yesterday morning for Havre with a large general cargo. This will be the last trip from St. John which this vessel will make this season.

The steamer Manchester, Division, which arrived on Thursday from Manchester, shifted in to No. 15 berth yesterday, from the island.

The C. G. M. liner Alston arrived in port yesterday from St. Nazaire, France, with general cargo. She will load general cargo from here to St. Nazaire.

The C. P. O. S. liner Gramplan which was due here today is now not expected until Monday. She has 1,200 passengers on board.

The Robert Reford Company has announced that the Cunard Line steamer Royal George will be placed on the Canadian service during the coming season.

Since the armistice she has been sailing between New York and English ports. The C. P. O. S. liner Sicilian sailed about 10:30 last evening for Glasgow with a small passenger list, mails and general cargo.

Among the passengers who will sail on the C. P. O. S. liner Melita this evening will be Colonel Hon. Harold and Lady Violet Henderson of Ottawa, the Hon. Marguerite Shaughnessy, Lady Shaughnessy, the Falcons of Winnipeg, winners of the Allan cup hockey championship, and a delegation to the world conference of the W. C. T. U. in London.

A number of English immigrants who have signified their intention of settling in this province are en route here on the C. P. O. S. liner Empress of France. J. Willard Smith has received word that the schooner C. Maud Gaskill arrived at Turk's Island from Funchal, Madeira. She will only eighteen days on the voyage.

The British full-rigged ship Talus which sailed from Glasgow on June 14, 1919, and has long since been given up as lost, is in command of Captain John A. MacDonald, who for years commanded vessels of the Howard D. Line of this city. He was a native of P. E. Island, where his wife and two daughters reside.

To Aid Boy Scout Work. The Bangor Commercial says editorially:

"Bangor Rotarians are to give an impetus to the Boy Scout organization in this city and section and as the Rotarians do not do things by halves, they are certain that much benefit will result from their interest in the movement. Boys' work is something in which Rotarians all over the country interest themselves, so that the effort now to be made here is in line with general Rotary policy."

Those are the kind of things that are being done here. The Boy Scout movement is a movement that has grown by leaps and bounds all over the world, and has far cities have strong organizations that lead the boys to high the Rotarians and idealists as they promote wholesome activities and afford amusement for the lads in their hours of leisure.

"Bangor has hardly kept the pace of places of its size in connection with the Boy Scout movement. This is because the effect here has been intermittent and has depended upon the personal work of a few. These few deserve much credit for their efforts but they will accomplish far more when aided by the Rotary Club and the Bangor Chamber of Commerce, which plans to co-operate with the Rotarians in developing the organization."

"One of the most important plans is the engagement of a trained scoutmaster which is an essential of present day scout activities. Volunteer scoutmasters often do very good work but business time is very limited and business cares demand their attention."

Everybody today knows of the value of Boy-Scout work, which during the war rose to imposing dimensions in many communities. It is a source of gratification that the development of the organization in this city is now to be undertaken by the Rotarians and the Chamber of Commerce. This means much to the boys and to the future of the city."
