


butter, ½ lb. brown sugar. Cream the butter and sugar and mix in the flour until all is worked in. Roll about ½ inch thick and bake in a slow oven. AUNT SUE'- COOKIES. One cup sugar, 2-3 cup butter and lard mixed, 1 well-beaten egg, ½ cup sweet. milk. Sift 1 heaping teaspoonful baking powder in a little flour. Flavor with nutmeg. Flour to roll. Have oven hot, but watch closely. DATE PIE. One-half pound of dates, let soak in one and a half pints of sweet milk on back of stove where they will keep warm but not cook. Let stand about two hours, then rub through a sieve into a rich pie crust. It will thicken like custard when baked. Frost with beaten whites of two eggs, little sugar.
