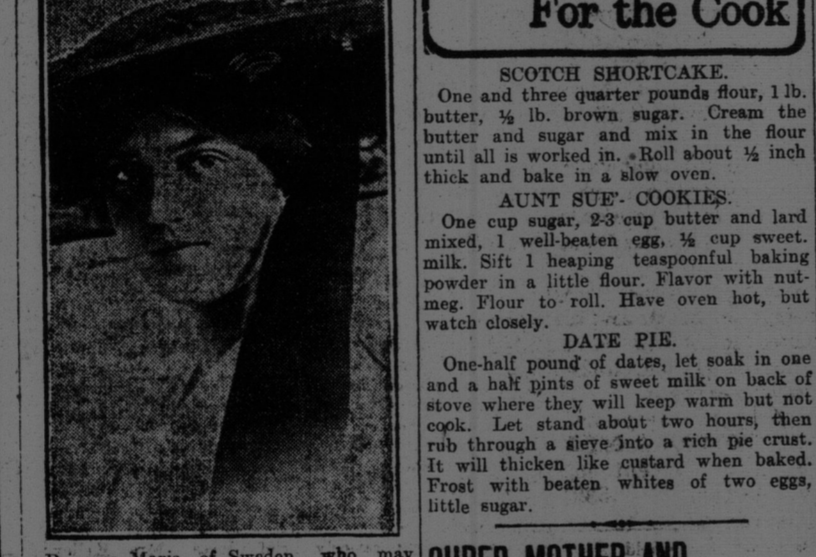

ST. JOHN AS A MAIL PORT

(Ottawa Journal). "The scheduled sailing of the Empress of Ireland was for Friday, May 2, from St. John, and on May 3 from Halifax, but in conformity with the new plan the Empress will begin her voyage on Thursday, May 1, and will proceed without stop of any kind to her destination. The sailing will be the last of the winter season, but the C. P. R. and Allan Line are expected to cut out the Halifax call entirely and to make St. John their only Canadian terminal, while the White Star and Canadian Northern steamers will probably end their voyages at Halifax. The new arrangement will give Canada a better mail service, and will prove, it is believed, the contention long made on behalf of St. John that by going there direct the mails will reach Montreal and the west in quicker time than has been possible heretofore.
