Let us kindly ask you to stand by the old landmarks of our "Christianity in earnest." 1st, the *means*, viz: *The regular prayer meeting*. Do not leave the leader and one or two others to do all the work, and get all the good of so vital a means of grace.

The *Class Meeting*—that thermometer of Christian standing and experience; do not let it denote that your joy and interest in experimental religion is below freezing point. Be among the number of those who "speak often one to another." Heed St. Paul's admonition, "forsake not the assembling of yourselves together; but exhort one another, and so much the more as ye see the day approaching."

The *Love Feast*.—Stand by it and sustain it, make your Quarterly Meetings feasts of love and grace to your souls. Do not be afraid of travelling a few miles to get to your religious Quarterly meetings. "Have fellowship one with another."

2nd—The *Ordinances*.—The *table of the Lord*. Be in your place at it, both young and old. Remember your loving Saviour said with his dying breath, "Do this in remembrance of me." Do not dare to grieve His heart by disregarding His dying request, the man that doth so robs his own soul, and dishonors his profession. See that you live as becometh a
