The Soviet Annexation.—Sergeant Spence, Capt. McLennan, arrived this morning in town of the tug Neptune from Mount Desert, where she was ashore. The Soviet struck near Mount Desert during a thick fog on Sunday morning last. She went on at low water and the incoming tide set her further up on the shore. The tug Neptune was sent from here to assist her off, but Capt. McLennan and his crew had fastened before the tug arrived. While the schooner was being warped off a large saw hammer and two anchors were lost. The vessel's keel is gone and her rigging posts and some planks in the bilge are damaged.
