KITCHENER'S SUMMARY OF LATE GAINS.

From June 24 to July 1 Many Boers Were Killed or Captured.

London, July 1.—A despatch received at the war office from Gen. Kitchener states that since June 24 the various British columns in South Africa report: Boers killed, 74; Boers wounded, 60; Boers captured, 100; Boers surrendered, 136; rifles captured, 131; rounds ammunition, 15,800; wagons, 304.

A despatch from Kromstadt to the Daily Mail gives the following summary of the situation which the correspondent says shows great promise of an early settlement, although Boer bitterness may again upset calculations. The projected re-invasion of Cape Colony was a fiasco, owing to the unwillingness of the Boer leaders to risk similar treatment to that of De Wet. Hertzog is in disgrace owing to expressing a wish to surrender, and he is reported that he has been relieved of his command.

The military situation is as follows: Commandant Beyers, one of the most dangerous of the Boer leaders, is lagged still at Zand River Post, two attempts to dislodge him from which resulted in little more than the capture of a few point.
