Ottawa, March 23.—Abbe Thellier de Poucherville, who was decorated twice by the French Government, paid tribute to the gallant French soldiers in an address on "The Soldiers of France," given before members of L'Association francoise in the Chateau Laurier last night. He confessed that words were insignificant in describing the valiant actions of his fellow countrymen. At Verdun they held back the enemy for the long months. Abbe Thellier was on the firing line on many occasions with France's heroes. He saw them at all hours and they were always the same, happy but determined to crush a ruthless foe.

The St. John Campaign. During the week the systematic canvass of the Loyalist city on behalf of the Killies, under the auspices of the Committee of One Hundred, has been vigorously carried on. The results of this canvass for recruits have, in some respects, been rather startling. For example: Of the 715 men who have been interviewed and personally canvassed 21 per cent are unquestionably fit for military service. This percentage is a marked improvement on the 15 per cent which was reported at the present time like adequate business reasons for their non-enlistment. The number of men who are actually in the service is about seven per cent of the total. Five per cent have absolutely refused to answer questions or to be interviewed in any way by the representatives of the Battalion or the Committee. Twenty-one per cent have given unqualified "No" answers, saying they do not intend to enlist as they have no interest in the war, or that conscription only will force them to do the uniform.
