

Such order and petition to be delivered in to the Courts of King's Bench.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that whensoever any person or persons, body or bodies politic or corporate, shall have presented any such petitions and obtained such order for the hearing and determining thereof as aforesaid, it shall be lawful to and for him or them, eight days at least after having given communication of the said Petition and Order to His Majesty's Attorney-General, or in his absence, to His Majesty's Solicitor or Advocate-General with notice of the day when the said Petition and Order shall be exhibited and filed in Court as hereafter to exhibit and deliver such Petition and Order in and to the Courts of King's Bench of and for the District wherein the Lands and Tenements, or immobiliary property to which the action, claim or demand relates shall be situate; and in case the action, claim or demand is for any sum or sums of money, goods or other mobiliary property, then to any Court of King's Bench having competent Jurisdiction, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful to and for such Court of King's Bench to make such orders for the hearing, trying and determining of any such action, claim or demand, and to hear, try and determine the same, in such a manner as to Law and Justice doth appertain, any Law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

The Court to determine thereupon.

Judgment of the Court in such case to have the same effect as if rendered between private persons.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every Order and Judgment to be made and rendered by any of the said Courts of King's Bench upon any such Petition and Order exhibited and delivered as aforesaid, shall have the same force and authority and be subject to the same appeal or other legal recourse as if the same had been made and rendered between private persons, any Law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

Proviso.

IV. Provided always and be it further enacted, by the aforesaid Act, that in all cases where the chief action or demand shall have been instituted by or in the name of His Majesty, the Defendant may from his incidental demand or demands against His Majesty without being held to observe the formalities by this Act prescribed, any Law, usage or custom to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
