## Instep control

You must be able to control the ball when it is passed to you. One way to control the ball is with the instep. Your insteps are marked by the laced area of your soccer shoes.

- Judge flight (speed and direction) of ball
- Move to get in line with flight of ball

- Extend leg and present instep to ball

- On contact cushion ball by relaxing and lowering leg to ground
- Do you know what you are doing with the ball?

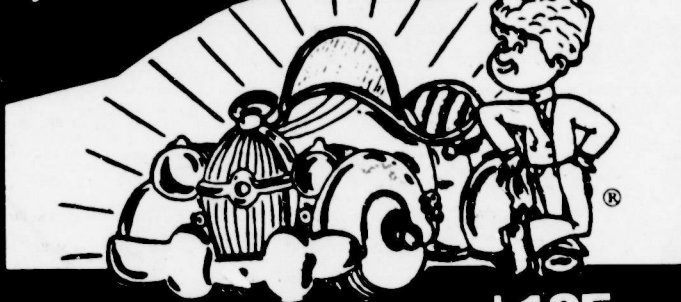

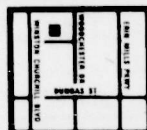
