Dear Sir:-

Your favour of the 3rd instant enclosing letter from Department of Indian affairs is to hand, and I am greatly obliged for the same. As requested by you I am returning you herewith the original letter from the Department.

I am advised that the Reserve will receive a great deal of benefit from the County roads built in the vicinity of the Reserve, and that when Mr. A. P. McDougald and Mr. John Stuart were down in Ottawa Mr. McDean. Assistant Deputy, gave them to understand that there would be no charge made for the gravel by the Band or the Department, and that if they settled with Fox that that would be all that they required to do. Under these circumstances it occurs to me that perhaps if they were reminded of the interview with Mr. McDougald and Mr. Stuart and the promise made to them they would forego the charge of 10¢ per load mentioned in Mr. McDean's letter.

I would be glad of any suggestions which you can make as to the best manner of arranging this matter with the Department.
