Ottawa, November 20, 1925,

Dear Mr. Meighen:

I enclose herewith a letter from Mr. Roy, of

St-Pie, P.Q., and suggest that you wire him whatever
you may decide is the wisest thing to do. You will

note in my reply, copy of which I also attach, I have
intimated you would be prepared to go to Bagot, providing
there is a desire on the part of the Conservatives in the
riding that you should go. I have not seen Senator
L'Esperance since you left, and, following your wish
and instructions, I am leaving the matter in his hands
and not interfering. This is the first letter I have
written to anyone on the subject.

I thought it dendwisable to say anything to Roy in the way of discouraging him from dealing with Mr. Rogers, as apparently Roy reposes great confidence in Rogers, as evidenced not only by his letter but from what he said to us when we had a conference with him in your office, hence the desirability of handling the matter very carefully.
