In connection with the question of giving permiselon to make disposition of the riparian rights of the Indians of the Mission Reserve, belonging to the squamish Band, I beg to say that it is considered advisable to have a surrender of these rights from the Indians, and I inclose, therefore, a surrender form, in duplicate, which you are hereby authorized to submit to the Indians in eccordance with the provisions of the Indian Act. If surrender is assented to, you will be good enough to have the date filled in and have it signed by a number of the Indians, and the afridavit of execution made by yourself and a Chief and Principal Man before a Judge or gtipendiary Magintrate, and then return the documents to the Department.


