- (ii) Provision is made for 14 days' training in camp to follow each of the first two years of intramural training. Students passing the written examination on Syllabus "A" may proceed to 0.T.Cs. to complete the qualifications during the summer vacation. Those not desiring an Active Force commission may take courses based on Syllabus "B" or "C" in their third or subsequent years, proceeding to camp school for two weeks during the summer vacation for R.F. qualification.
- (iii) Uniforms and medical care are to be provided on the same basis as for Reserve Units.

The strength was 701 (696) officers, 12,926 (12,884) other ranks. Janted to complete establishment: 54 (59) officers, 1,426 (1,468) other ranks.

(c) 6th Division Brigade Groups (not reported previously as a formation)

The strength was 260 officers, 5,313 other ranks (Active) and 956 N.R.H.A. recruits. Wanted to complete establishment: 214 officers, 4,066 other ranks.

(d) Corps. Army and L. of C. Troops

The strength of Ancillary Troops in Canada was 370 (348) officers, 5,328 (5,237) other ranks. Janted to complete establishment: 145 (131) officers, 1,436 (736) other ranks.
