"I had just come in from down the yard and I saw two soldiers standing in the corner. I came straight in and then my husband came up the yard and I heard sounds of an argument. I looked out and saw one of the soldiers holding him by the collar and tie. I came straight in again to the children. Mr Foster came outside at practically the same time. The argument continued and I stayed indoors.

QUESTIONED BY THE OFFI ER TAKING THE SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

- Q.1 Gould you identify the man who was holding your husband by the coller and tie?
- A.1 Yes, but I can't identify the other soldier because his back was turned.
- Q.2 When you came inside did you continue to watch the argument through the window?
- A.2 Well I was stending at this window and I couldn't see much, only the soldier holding my husband.
- Q.5 When Mr Foster came on the scene did the soldier release your husband?
- A.3 I cen't say, I was indoors, I didn't notice that.
- Q.4 Did you see the soldier expose himself in any way?
- A.4 No.

The accused declines to cross examine the witness.
