RAINHAM.

Rainham is a triangular-shaped township bounded west by Walpole, east by Cayuga, and south by Lake Erie. Its settlement commenced in the year 1793, and in 1817 it contained, with Walpole, 247 inhabitants. There were at that period in the two townships no school, store, or tavern. In 1835, the population of Rainham was 552; in 1852, it had increased to 1618, and there were 15,000 acres under cultivation. The land is of good quality, and the township is well watered.

Census of 1861.—Occupiers of land, 269; amount held in acres, 23.745; under cultivation, 13,255; under crops, 10,395; pasture, 2706; gardens and orchards, 154; wood and wild lands, 10,490; cash value of farms, \$699,732. Population, 2116; equalized assessment, 1866, \$368,756.
