ELEVENTH SESSION

OF THE

Diocesan Synod of Aoba Scotia.

FIRST DAY.

THE Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia met, in accordance with a summons from the Bishop, at Halifax, in the Cathedral Church of St. Luke, on Tuesday, June 30, 1874.

There were Prayers at nine o'clock, A. M., and a Celebration of the Holy Communion, the Bishop being Celebrant.

Immediately after the celebration, the rolls were called by the Secretaries, and there were present sixty-nine of the Clergy and fifteen Lay Representatives.

The Rev. Alfred Brown was, on motion of Rev. J. Abbott, seconded by Rev. Dr. Uniacke, appointed Clerical Secretary. The late Secretary, having been appointed Archdeacon of Nova Scotia, was not a candidate for the office.

R. J. Wilson, Esq., was appointed Lay Secretary, temporarily, during the unavoidable absence of W. Myers Gray, Esq.

The Bishop delivered his opening address. The certificates of Lay Representatives were referred to a Committee consisting of A. M. Cochran, Esq., W. Gossip, Esq., and the Lay Secretary.

The Minutes of the proceedings of the last day of the last Session were read and approved.

Rev. R. Warren and Rev. J. R. Campbell were appointed to the Board of Foreign Missions, in the places made vacant by the deat tion of Rev Rev. Dr
