HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 5g, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood tost for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 ares, more or less, more or less.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homested desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A few of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

At least six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is devasced) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent case of the certificate of the issue of such patent case of the certificate of the for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by resistence upon the form the domestead, if the homestead, second is in the vicinity of the true homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining r cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Housested Inspector the must give at months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
