ORDERED, That Mr. Mure, Mr. Stuart, Mr. Lee, Mr. Bourdages, and Mr. Taschereau, do compose the said Committee.

On motion of Mr. Mure, seconded by Mr. Bernier,

RESOLVED, That an Humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor in Chief, praying he may be pleased to direct the proper officers to lay before this House, an Account of the Imports into this Province, and of the Exports thence, during the last year, also, of the number of Ships or Vessels, and their tonnage, that have been entered and cleared at the Port of Quebec, during same period.

ORDERED, That Mr. Mure, Mr. Huot, Mr. Bourdages, Mr. Lee, Mr. Bell, Mr. Dénéchau, Mr. Papineau, and Mr. Langlois, do present the said Address to His Excellency the Governor in Chief.

Mr. Blanchet, from the Committee appointed to prepare and report the draft of an humble Address and Representation to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, on the state of the Province, reported, that the Committee had prepared the said Address, and had directed him to submit it to the House, whenever it shall be pleased to receive the same. And he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's table, where it was again read.
