Mr. Tonge, and Mr. Marfters; and that they do examine into the merits of the fame, and report their opinion thereon to the Houfe.

Then the Houfe adjourned until Monday at Eleven of the Clock.

PRAYERS,

On motion of Mr. Roach, *refolved*, that a Committee be appointed to examine into the expenditure of all monies voted for roads and bridges, which have not yet been accounted for to the Legislature; and also to confider the amount of the compensation to be allowed to Commissioners for expending such part of the faid monies as were granted prior to the last Session of General Assumption, and report thereon to the House.

Ordered, that Mr. Roach, Mr. Crane, Mr. Archibald, Mr. Collins, and Mr. Mortimer, be a Committee for the above purpofe.

A Petition of David Currie was prefented by Mr. Lawfon, and read, praying for a Drawback of the Excife Duty on a quantity of British Merchandise by him exported to Jamaica the 2d August, 1800, amounting to 5l. 4s. 3d.

A Petition of Alexander Scott, and others, inhabitants of Douglafs, was prefented by Mr. Dimock, and read, praying that the fum of, 1001 may be granted for improving the road leading from James M'Phee's Farm, on the Nine Mile River, in faid Township, towards Shubenaccadie Bridge, to enable them to have access to a market with their produce.

Ordered, That the faid Petitions do lie on the Table.

A Petition of John Archibald was prefented by Mr. Pearfon, and read, fetting forth that the Petitioner was appointed a Commissioner for the expenditure of 4451 granted in the last Session of Asiembly for repairing the Roads and Bridges between Fletcher's and Pictou; that the Petitioner finding the fums so granted to be quite infufficient to complete the repairs of the faid Road and Bridges had expended, of his own monies, the additional fum of twenty-fix pounds two shillings and eight pence, and praying to be repaid the faid fum fo expended by him.

Mr. Roach moved, that the faid Petition be difinified, which being feconded and put; paffed in the negative.

A Petition of Robert M'Elhenny was prefented by Mr. Chandler, and read, praying compensation as a Commissioner for expending the fum of 80l. in building a Bridge over the river Cheganoise in the year 1801.

Ordered, That the Petition do lie on the Table.

On motion of Mr. Hutchinson, *refolved*, that a Committee be appointed to wait on his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, to request that his Excellency would direct the Secretary of the Province to lay before this House; all Accounts of the Expenditures of Monics on roads and bridges with vouchers for the same, which have been transmitted to him by the Commissioners appointed under the Act of the last Session of General Assembly; and also, that his Excellency would be pleased to direct, that the accounts and vouchers of the expenditure of monies for the service of the Island of Sable, and the public buildings be laid before the House.

Ordered, That Mr. Archibald, Mr. Haliburton, and Mr. Dewolf, be a Committee for the above purpofe.
