At the GENERAL-ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at HALIFAX, on the Sixth Day of June, Anno Domini 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by feveral Prorogations until the Twelfth Day of June, Anno Domini 1775, in the Fifteenth Year of His faid Majesty's Reign, being the Fifth GENERAL-Assembly convened in the faid Province.

## A P.

An ACT in Amendment of an Act made in the Eighth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act for granting to his Majesty a Duty on Wheel Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax.

\*\* HERE AS by the Second and Third Sections Preamble. of an Act, made in the Eighth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An "Act for graning to his Majesty a Dury on Wheel \*\* Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax," It is Engoted, That all Owners of Wheel Carriages shall enter their Names and the Number and Kinds of Carriages and Horses they respectively use, with the Collector of Excise Duties at Halifax, and shall pay the Duties by them respectively payable, to the said Collector, And Whereas it is tho't expedient, that the Clerk of the Licenses should for the future take the faid Entries, and receive the Duty imposed by the said Act.

I. Be it Enacted by the Governor, Council and Affembly, That Owners of wheelfrom and after the first Day of August next, all and every Person carriages to enter and Persons who are owners of Wheel Carriages, liable to Duty the same with &

pay duty to, the Clerk of Licenses.
