FOURTEEN HELD IN DYNAMITE CASE P.

Scores Were Arrested as Result of Explosion in a Chicago Building

By Courier Leased Wire Chicago, Sept. 5 .- Fourteen men were held to-day out of scores seized by federal agents and the police as a result of the explosion of a bomb yesterday in the Federal building, which killed four persons, injured more than 30 others, and did considerable damage to property. A night of activity on the part of the federal agents and the police heads of the respective departments, said they had obtained valuable information which encouraged them to believe they would apprehend the

bomb-thrower.

The four persons killed were near the Adams street entrance, just outside which were found the bodies of the victims—a girl entering the building, a Great Lakes jackie, also about to enter, and a mail carrier on his way to work. The fourth victim, a mail carrier, was leaving the building, having just finished


