**DESTRUCTIVE FIRE AND SAD DEATH AT CANNING.**

On Sunday Mr. Joseph H. Wood, of Norths Corner near Canning met with a sad loss in the destruction of his home and death of an adopted boy.

Mr. Wood and the boy who was 14 or 15 years of age had been out driving. They returned about 5 o'clock in the afternoon and Mr. Wood went to the house while the boy cared for the team. About 15 minutes later the barn was discovered on fire and the flames soon filled the whole building. Nothing could be saved from the barn it being consumed with all its contents including two horses.

The flames blew across the well preventing access to the handy water. A great number gathered and fought the fire heroically but the house could not be saved. It was burned with part of the contents.

After the fire the body of the young boy was found in the barn, where he must have been suffocated in trying to extinguish the fire before calling for help. Mr Wood's loss and affliction is deeply felt.

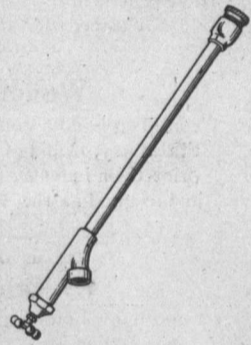
