### HOCKEY

MONTREAL, Feb. 17.—Getting away to a good break, Ottawa assumed the lead over Canadiens in their match at the Arena Saturday night and retained it to the end, winning by a score of 3 to 2. The winners always seemed to have the better of the play and the team showed marked improvement over previous games here. Through brilliant checking back and combinations, Ottawas had the locals on the defence almost constantly. The play warmed up as time progressed, developing into a match by roughness, with Canadiens the greater aggressors, a fact which probably cost them a victory.

Pitre started the trouble by going after Darragh. In the opening period he gave the Ottawa player the butt end of his stick. This was overlooked. On resuming play in the second 20 minutes Pitre again started in at Darragh. After he had been checked by the Ottawa forwards near the penalty bench, he crossed-checked Darragh over the eye, which put Darragh out for the remainder of the game. Pitre was given a match foul for the offence, weakening the team's chances.

Rough House Tactics  
Lalonde then started in to rough it, and was given a major. In the next session he charged Merrill, giving him a cross-check, drawing another major penalty and was pulled off twenty minutes, which meant the remainder of the match. With Pitre and Lalonde off, both the line and the defence were weakened.

Any luck that was going fell to the lot of the winners was shown in the second session when Merrill reverted to the style of hockey of ten years ago and took a long shift at the Canadiens' nets from his position at cover. In trying to stop the puck Donald Smith altered its direction and it rolled into the nets unopposed by Venezia. This proved to be the winning goal, as it was the last scored by Ottawa while Canadiens added another to their score in the last twenty minutes.

Quebec vs Tecumsehs 8.  
QUEBEC, Feb. 17.—The N.H.A. champions defeated the Tecumsehs here Saturday night by the score of 11 to 8. Billy Nicholson, in goal for the visitors, kept the score down.

The ice was in splendid condition, but the attendance was smaller than usual.

TORONTO, Feb. 17.—In a slow, listless game the Torontos defeated the Wanderers at the Arena on Saturday night, 10 to 3. There were no bright features to the game, the work of the visitors being monotonous at all times. After their decisive defeat at the hands of Quebec on Wednesday, the local youngsters were expected to be as badly defeated by the Wanderers. Instead, they reversed the score.

## BOY BISHOP IS CHOSEN

BERDEN, ESSEX, PERPETUATES A CURIOUS OLD CUSTOM.

Master Frederick Brett Now Wears the "Episcopal Robes" of His Quaint Office and is Expected to Be a Model to the Boys of His Village For the Next Year—Has Chosen His Officers.

In accordance with an ancient and curious custom the parish church at Berden, in Essex, Eng., recently held its election of a "boy bishop." The election which was participated in by the other boys of the parish is an annual affair, and this year resulted

in the selection of Frederick Brett, who is depicted herewith in his official robes.

For one year the boy bishop is expected to be the model lad of the village, and it is his business to set an example in kindness and good deeds. From his playmates he selects other boys of the parish to assist him at the regular services of the church.

The election falls, of course, on the boy who has shown the greatest capacity along the line of good behavior and if English lads are anything like Canadian ones his task as a model for his companions will not be an easy one. Whether he will experience any of the resentment which is usually the share of an official model is a question, but the sympathy of many will go out to him in his arduous duties.

## 97 Years In One Family.

Sixty-five years in the service of one family is a remarkable record standing to the credit of Miss Mary Ann Lancaster, who remained all that time in domestic service at the Stoke Newington family and recently died, in her 97th year. But it is not exceptional. Mr. William Sly, secretary of the Domestic Servants' Benevolent Institution, of which Miss Lancaster was a member, stated that the books contained hundreds of names of servants who had remained in the same employment for 50 years and upward. "A servant at Lieburn who passed away in January, 1909, in her 107th year," he said, "had seen 97 years' service with three generations of one family." A number of servants have, out of their hard earned savings, contributed to the funds of the institution. In gifts from servants the institution has received nearly £500, and in trust funds £2,265. One supporter, a butler, left a sufficient sum to provide for a pension of £23 per annum to the oldest female beneficiary. Another servant left £1,000 in trust for two pensions of £20 and £15 for needy servants. One pensioner has attained the age of 101 and has received benefits aggregating £368.

## Curious Charms.
