### A LONE HAND

**Russia Announces That She Will Play it in China.**

St. Petersburg, October 16.—The Russian government permits it to be known that its attitude in China will be increasing independence of the concert of the powers.

Russia, it is explained, is disposed to attach less value to joint action since her interests have been fully secured by the successful campaign in Manchuria.

Moreover, Russia is not willing to "follow the irremovable policy of some of the powers."

The expectation, the publication adds, is that the Chinese government is about to utilize all its resources of duplicity to keep the powers occupied with vain negotiations and proposals and the dispatching of notes in connection with the winter, countering the rigor of the climate to prevent military operations and allow China to gather her resources for a spring campaign.

### QUITE TOO QUICK.

**Rabbit Hunter Fires Before he is Sure and Kills a man.**

Chicago, Oct. 17.—A special to the Record from Denver, Col., says—Arthur W. Green was shot and instantly killed in mistake by O. W. Johnson, a rabbit-hunter. Green was out with his sweetheart, Miss Katie Mockridge, taking pictures in the foothills near Golden. He had donned Katie's hat, and she was just about to take his picture when Johnson came over a hill. Seeing a moving gray object he mistook it for a rabbit and sent a charge of shot into Green's head.

## LAURER IN TORONTO

### Mr. Cook Meets Him With a Challenge Which the Premier Does Not Accept.

Toronto, Oct. 17.—H. H. Cook, ex-M.P., yesterday addressed a lengthy open letter to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, prior to his meeting, in which he reiterated his charges against the Government and invited the Premier to either deny or explain them away. The letter was as follows:—

Toronto, Oct. 16, 1900.

Right Honorable Sir Wilfrid Laurier,

Dear Sir,—Recently I addressed a letter to the Liberal electors of Canada, in which I charged that the present leaders of the Liberal party, yourself and your colleagues in the Cabinet, have betrayed the principles of our party, have been false to your pledges, and broken faith with the people of Canada. In that letter I said that the record of our party while in power under the leadership of yourself and your colleagues has been one long shameful story of promises unfulfilled and pledges broken, of extravagance, jobbery and corruption, and of the most shameful betrayal of every principle for which the party has stood in the past.

Recognizing the seriousness of the charge I made, and realizing the responsibility which anyone must assume in making such a charge against the leaders of the party to which he himself belongs, I felt that I ought not, in fairness to you and your colleagues, and to the members of our party generally, to make a general charge of this nature without giving specific instances and examples of the dishonesty and

of yourself and your colleagues, and

league of yours; for a man who never made or sought to make a dollar out of politics need not hesitate to invite such a comparison between himself and one who has become wealthy by making the most of his opportunities. But permit me to say that neither my reputation as a man or politician nor the motives that may influence me in making them are of consequence in matters of this kind. The question is, are the charges I have made true? If they are not, you owe it to yourself, to your party and to the country to deny them; deny them specifically and give evidence in support of your denial. I say you owe this to the country as well as to yourself and the party, for it will not be held by any honorable man that the country is not vitally interested in knowing whether the men entrusted with its government are or are not promise breakers and

Do not content yourself with glittering and meaningless generalities, but speak plainly, so that if I have accused you and your colleagues wrongly, the public and particularly the rank and file of your party may know it.
