

The women bore a hole in their top lip and gradually increase this until it is able to inclose a disk of wood two and even three inches in diameter. A Mubira woman came to call on us whose disk measured two and five-eighths inches across. The size of the wood inserted proclaims the rank of the person. Peasants are only allowed to wear pieces of stick of the same dimensions as a match.

The weight of the wood causes the lip to fall down over the mouth, and in order to eat it is necessary to lift up this shutter with one hand while the other conveys the food to the mouth. Frequently the lip breaks under the strain put upon it, in which case the disconnected ends are carried back and tied to the ear .- "On the Borders of Pygmy Land."

ARMY STRIKE-BREAKERS

Berlin Electrical Works to Be

Arrangements Made to Bring In 150 cautionary Measure Against Strike

Excesses—Car Service Stops.

Berlin, Oct. 2.—The negotiations between the electrical companies and their employes for higher wages were broken off to-day and a general strike in the works manufacturing electrical apparatus and supplies has been ordered for to-morrow. Part of the employes of the power and lighting works went out on a sympathetic strike to-day without awaiting the result of the conference of the labor leaders with the employers. Consequently one-third of the street cars were stopped.

The municipal government, acting on the principle that unlighted streets are a danger to the public, has ordered fifty engineers from the fire companies to the various power houses.

As the army contains many thousand of trained workers in every trade, the company has applied to the minister owar for temporary details of engineers and stokers. These have been refused on the ground that it is unnecessary at present, but arrangements have been made to bring 150 engineers from the torpedo battalions at Kiel.

The war ministry has also declined to issue an order announcing to discharged soldiers, about 200,000 of whom have served out their terms, that engin ers and stokers could find employment with the electrical companies, but the army administration will offer no objection to battalion commanders giving out such notices.


