hocking Murder in a Prison, The viotim was Thomas Salter, a member of one of the oldest and most respected families in this city, and his assassin is a convet named Everett or Evans. Salter was a jeweller by trade, and for several years kept a store in this city, but falling into intemperate habits he went behind and was acid out. He subsequently became as employee in Mons' jeweller's store, and while there entered into a conspiracy with a gang of New York burglars to prob his employer. In a lucid moment he repented of what he was going on, and swore informations against his companions, all of whom were arrested, tried, and convicted. Salter on the trial gave crooked evidence, and was in turn indicted for perjury, a conviction following. He was sentenced to two years, and the members of the gang to seven years each. Since his conviction Salter has been at empity with his former colleagues, and especially with Everett. Yesterday Salter and Everett were conversing together, when the latter charged Salter with trying to get him sent to Kingston, where the discipline is more severe than in the provincial penitentiary. What answer Salter gave is unknown, but the next moment Everett frew a knife and punged it into Salter's breast, the unfortunate man falling dead with the exclamation "Oh, my tod!" on his lips. An attempt was made to arrest the assassin, but be threatened to kill anyone who approached him. He them deliberately cut his throat, and although the blood was flowing freely no one dared come near him until the arrival of the Roman Catholic obsplain, who induced him to lay down his knife and surrender. He was then secured. At the inquest a verdict of "wilful murder" was returned. The deceased was well known and highly respected.
