CENTRAL INDIA.

Tantia Toppee, cousin of Nana Sahib had in the early part of October, a force of Post Office department, 30,000 men, with 4000 cavalry and 30 guts. The victory gained over them by General Mitchell is the most importent event hrought by the present mail. Tantia Topee was hemned in a well concerted movement from different points ; Mitchell's force cama up with him at the morning halt. The enemy was observed at the distance of a mile advaucing with their cavalry in front. The alarm was instantly sounded; the artillerymen sprang to their guns. The enemy's cavalry formed in a line about a mile in advance of the main body and waited ; Mitchell's guns unlimbered 600 yards with shell, and threw the rebels into immediate confusion. A charge followed, during which left. 


