### OUT FOR 75c AN HOUR

TORONTO, Feb. 4.—"Seventy five cents an hour."

This is the slogan of the men employed by the Toronto Railway Company on their cars. Not even the frosty weather made them hesitate to discuss the matter on the cars today.

The press took a trip over several of the lines this morning and learned from the men that nothing definite had been done by their union nor had the increase been discussed at a meeting, but there is a general feeling that they cannot meet their obligations at a scale of 55 cents an hour.

One motorman said: "I am going behind every day. With me it is 75 cents an hour or bust."

The leaders of the union will not discuss the matter, but they won't deny that there is talk about an increase.

"The present agreement expires in June, and it's a little too cold and too soon to talk much," was the opinion of one of the leaders.

The suggestion that Toronto enter the dead meat business was endorsed by the property committee of the City Council.

### CONDEMNNS EMPLOYING MEN TO MAKE MAN BREAK LAW

MOOSE JAW, Sask., Feb. 3.—The jury in the case of the Crown v. Holdworth, by which the accused is charged under the Secret Commissions Act with "knocking down" fares while in the employ of the Canadian Pacific Railway, returned a verdict of not guilty today. Mr. Justice Newlands condemned the practise of employing men to make a man commit a crime for the sake of conviction, in the opening of his charge to the jury.

### "CONTEMPTIBLE THEFT" DECLARES MAGISTRATE

And Prisoner Goes to Jail Farm For Six Months' Term.

TORONTO, Feb. 3.—"It is a contemptible kind of theft—swindling the Government while holding a good job on the Fire Department," said Magistrate Denison in the police court yesterday in sentencing John L. Williams to six months imprisonment at the jail farm for obtaining relief from the Federal Emergency Appropriation Funds while he was drawing a weekly wage.

Williams was overseas for three years but for a long time after his return he had been out of employment. On December 12 he had been engaged by the Fire Department but on December 31 he had applied for and received a sum of money from the Government relief fund.

"I hope the Government will look after his wife and little children," said Mr. W. B. Horkins, who defended Williams.
