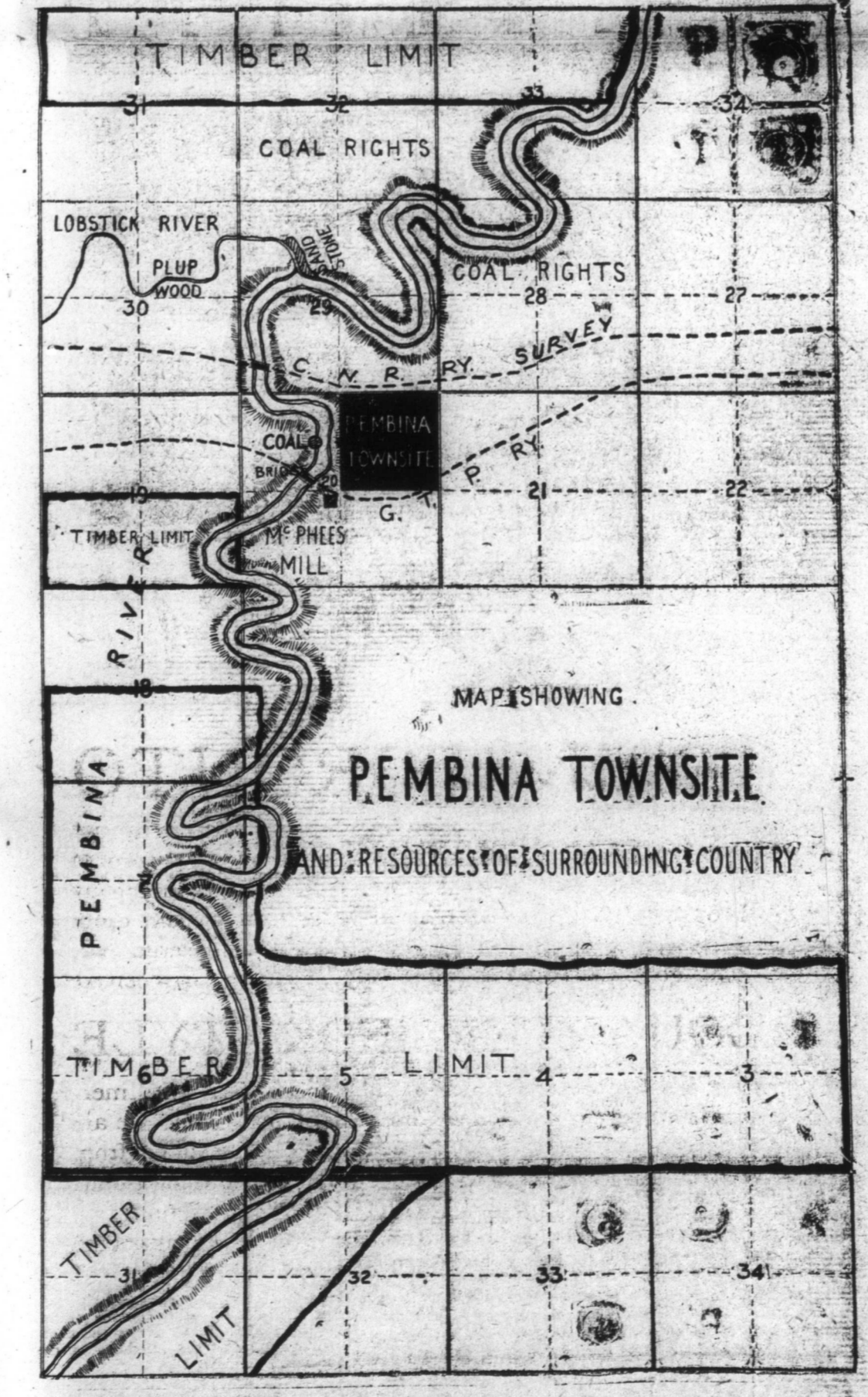

400 COTTON MILLS IDEL.
140,000 Operatives Are on Strike—Not Expected to Last Long.
Manchester, Eng., Sept. 22.—More than 400 cotton mills in Lancashire are idle today as a result of the dispute over wages between the operatives and the employers. This means that 40,000,000 spindles are wholly or partially stopped, and that more than \$250,000,000 in capital is not bringing in any return, and that 140,000 operatives are without work, and losing something over \$700,000 wages a week.
