RHEIMS, France, To-day.
The Chamber of Commerce of Rheims forwarded a protest to the French Government against the Tariff Bill now before the States Congress. The protest is based especially on the clauses of the Bill authorizing American Consular agents to examine the books of exporters.

LONDON, To-day.
The Standard says that although France has refused the request of Britain for the extradition of Christabel Pankhurst because of insufficient grounds, further representations for her return to England have been made. Miss Pankhurst is charged with incitement to crime outside of the political sphere. To these representations no reply has been made.

INVERMORE'S PASSENGERS.—The Invermore arrived at Port aux Basques at 8 a.m. to-day, bringing Thos. Shaver, S. E. Tunia, F. and Mrs. Esham, J. B. O'Reilly, W. J. Bradbury, B. Loob, J. B. Crichton and Mrs. J. Hennessy.

While skipper Patrick Mesh, of St. Brendan's, was coming along in his schooner, Thursday evening, and when about four miles east of Baie-Comeau, the vessel ran through several dead cattle floating in the water. One was taken on board and the hide was taken from it and sold on arrival here. At this season of the year cattle are often brought along here from Concepcion and Trinity Bays in small schooners. This would seem to indicate that either one of such vessels lost her deck load of live stock or that she came to grief in that locality, and another marine tragedy is added to an already large list of such casualties.
