Dear Uncle,—Just a line from Fort George, Scotland, to say ails well over in this bonnie country. The Regiment is comfortably installed in snug quarters, everyone is in the best of health and looking forward to a jolly Xmas in spite of it being from home.

A small Company of 200 Seaforth Highlanders is stationed across from us in another barracks, the rest of these gallant men are at Aldershot and the front where they are giving a good account of themselves. Hard training goes on as usual, but the harder it is the better we like it as it gives the inner man a good chance to show his powers. We haven't had a wet day since we have been in Scotland, and the air is crisp with a pinch of frost in it which makes you feel top-notch on a route march or skin-marching.

It is close by pen pushing also, and perhaps he has something interesting to tell you about the Regiment's movements which perhaps I have overlooked, and I guess I'll leave the rest for St. as its near lights out and sweet dreamy drearland and the folks you left behind. I close this short letter by wishing you one and all a Merry Xmas and a very Happy New Year.
