Not another acre should be given to railways. While the church is entitled to entire freedom in its own domain, I will oppose the granting to any creed or nationality of privileges not equally enjoyed by all. I believe in complete separation of. Church and State, and will defend to the utmost the rights and privileges that have been handed down to us by our forefathers. A simpler and less expensive method than the present system of preparing the voteralists is desirable, and the principle of one man one vote and the purity of elections I would heartily support.
