BUSH FIRES

Destroying Much Timber in Oxford County-Crops Suffer and Dwellings Endangered.

Woodstock, Sept. 18.—Another terrible fire is raging in Blandford, which threatens to sweep away three miles of bush land, the largest forest in Ox-ford county. The fire, which started some time ago, made tremendous headway yesterday. It began on the farm of John Edwards, on the 8th line of Blandford. Yesterday it first showed signs of spreading, and before long the flames were burning flerely, and unless there is rain enough to swamp it out, the three miles of bushland is bound to be fire-swept. It will be ten times worse fire if this happens, than the one in Tracksell swamp. The Trachsell swamp fire shows no signs of abating, and farmers in the region feel anxious as to the outcome. Amos Carder's farm, on the 5th line of Blandford, is entirely surrounded by fire. All his potatoes, corn and timber have been burned. The family

cannot sleep at night, but wait and watch to fight the enemy. At places on the 5th line the fire has burned through the road, making traveling on the 5th line extremely dangerous. At parts of the road the fire had got down four or five feet into the

vegetable mold. Of Sam Trachsell's 100 acres of forest all has been burned over but five acres; hundreds of cords of wood have been

The flames have reached within ten feet of George Roberts' house and barn, on the oth line, and are kept back by sheer force. Fences and everything else have been burned away.

The Trachsell fire started in places, at A. Tay's on the 4th, and Benjamin Bidds', on the 5th. The two fires ran around the lake until they met and joined forces.




