The tax is on different classes and ranges from about 30 cents to \$300 each annually. This is regarded in some quarters as being in the nature of a provision for war.

KING AND EMPEROR

His Majesty Visits the Austrian Royal Tombs.

Vienna, Sept. 2.—King Edward yesterday visited the Capuchin Church and its vaults, in which are sarcophagi including the remains of members of the Austrian royal family. Later he was entertained at luncheon at the British embassy, at which Emperor Francis Joseph and a number of notable personages were present. A family dinner was given this evening by the Archduchess Maria Joseph, the King and Empress being present.

A DARING FEAT

Man Wades Out to the Brink of Niagara Cataract.

Niagara Falls, Ont., Sept. 2.—Contractor Evan E. Fraser performed a perilous feat just before Cedar Island on the power development works. With the end of a stout line in one hand and an anchor bar in the other, he waded out into the rapids, just above the brink of the Horseshoe Falls, to the crib that broke away some time ago and lodged near the edge of the awful plunge into the gulf below. The shore end of the line Fraser held was in the hands of several workmen, and a breathless throng of people watched the daring man make his way through the boiling waters waist-deep to the crib. Twice he had to make the perilous trip, as the hook on the line slipped from the timbers, but he was successful in his undertaking, and the mass of square timber was swung around and hauled to shore by a gang of navvies. Mr. Fraser conducted this sensational performance with as much sangfroid as though it were part of his duty, instead of being a stunt that makes the Whirlpool Rapids swim pale into insignificance.

FIRE AT STRATHROY

R. G. Taylor's Livery Stable Was Destroyed.

Strathroy, Sept. 2.—At an early hour Monday fire was discovered in the haymow of R. G. Taylor's livery stable, Center street. The alarm was promptly given by Chief Wilson, and every horse and rig was saved. Quite a quantity of hay and oats was destroyed. The building was a frame one, probably worth \$1,000. Unfortunately there was only \$300 insurance thereon. The contents were fully covered by insurance, the loss probably going up to \$500 in hay, oats, robes, spreads, etc. It was fortunate indeed that the night was calm, as there could have been a number of frames and buildings added, but the firemen kept them safe.

NEW WORLD TO FREED CONVICT

Murderer Released After 27 Years Imprisonment

IS OVERCOME WITH EMOTION

He Had Never Seen a Trolley Car and Tastes His First Fried Chicken.

Herkimer, N. Y., Sept. 2.—Albert Fredenburgh, who was liberated from Auburn prison yesterday, having been pardoned by Gov. Odell after serving 27 years of a life sentence for the murder of Orlo Davis, in Gray, this country, in 1875, is at the Allerton Hotel in Little Falls. He will be taken to his old home in Gray, where he will spend his remaining years with the family of one of his old neighbors.

Fredenburgh is very feeble, and is barely able to walk on account of an injury to his right leg in prison, several years ago. He is also troubled some in talking, owing to an attack of paralysis, but his mind is perfectly clear and his appetite is of the best. Last night he dined on fried chicken, the first he has tasted in twenty-seven years. He called for three portions, and the amount he ate was astonishing. After supper he lit a cigar and was ready to talk.

"It seemed like a new world to me," said he, when asked how it felt to be out of prison. "I don't know what to make of it yet, it seems almost too good to be true," and he fairly cried with joy, it being several minutes before he could compose himself.

"I did not believe it when they told me I was pardoned. Why should I, after being behind prison walls for twenty-seven years? But when they took off the stripes and put on these black clothes I thought there was something in it. Even now when I close my eyes it seems as if I was back in prison. I would have been there any day, if I hadn't been for *Watts Bullock*. I didn't suppose anyone cared enough about me to try to get me out. *Watts* was a little shaver, but there was a self-sustaining energy under free trade, with probably two hundred millions of our English-speaking race, and a home market so big as to give control of neutral markets. No question of protection or preferential tariffs then to disturb us. Besides all this we should have been able to enforce peace among nations. Gentlemen, unfortunately an ocean exists where we should have had a river, and it is traversed in about the same time as the three thousand miles of land between Montreal and New York on the Atlantic coast. I don't know what you will do on the Pacific. Who so bold as to predict that never is one race to succeed in conquering the ocean? The C. N. CARNEGIE SAYS PLEASANT THINGS

Foretells the Day When Britain Will Be Mother Member of Anglo-American Union.

Barrow-in-Furness, England, Sept. 2.—The autumn conference of the Iron and Steel Institute opened here yesterday under the presidency of Andrew Carnegie.

Mr. Carnegie in opening said that the record in iron and steel of England, "the great little mother of nations," had not been equaled by any of her children, although her oldest and biggest sons, aspires to inherit his mother's indomitable spirit, and the ability to work miracles. No question of protection or preferential tariffs then to disturb us. Besides all this we should have been able to enforce peace among nations. C. N. R. NOT ABANDONED

Mr. Mackenzie Says They Are Going Right Ahead.
