The International Arbitration Conference at Lake Mohonk, N. Y. Lake Mohonk, N. Y. May 31.—The second day's session of the conference of international arbitration was opened with an address by Edwin D. Mead, of Boston the state of the second an address by Edwin D. Meau, or ton, in which he made a plea for a more setting advertise propaganda in favor of world-wide peace. S. R. Thayer, former-ly minister to Holland, told of great dif-

minister to Honana told of great difficulties yet to be overcome in the promotion of international peace. He spoke of the arbitration proposals formulated by the Pan-American conference in Washington in 1880, which failed of adoption. Holland, he said, was the only European nation that gave its adhesion to these proposals. to these proposals.

President W. W. Birdsall, of Swarth-President W. W. Birdsall, of Swarthmore College, drew attention to the expansion of educational facilities in recent years through college and university extension, the enlarged interest in scientific investigation, and new and better methods of teaching economies, all this tending, in his opinion, to promote unity among men, solidarity of interest, and a mere general recognition of natural rights and obligations.

The Rev. F. B. Allen, of Boston, criticised a primer on patriotism, which he cised a primer on patriotism, which, he said, the Grand Army of the Republic had circulated in the public schools of Massachusetts, and which he thought in-Massachusetts, and which he thought in-culcated erroneous ideas on the subject. Dr. Herrick Johnson, who was intro-duced as a man who had been fighting for peace in the Presbyterian denomina-tion for years, and had just won the victory, said that achievement had been brought about by quiet, persistent dis-cussion and education in public and pri-vate, going on during the last five years. He believed a similar effort should be made in the promotion of international
